Applying

Submit your CV to Rasheeda@BSGinterns.com.

Include personal email, University Emblem, and Skype name

Add a professional-looking, smiling head-shot. No selfies!

- the photo is the club's first impression of you....

Skype interview to further review, ID your needs, determine host match

Interview are then set up with the club.



J-1 Visa

Visas are simple for eligible students. Once placement is confirmed, BSG starts students with the online application process, and assists them every step of the way. The visa costs \$1,800 - \$2,500, including mandatory health insurance for the full program, and US government's SEVIS fee. At the visa stage, the US Embassy charges a \$160 fee.

BSG cautions students **NOT** to get their own visa – the chances of being denied are high.



Social Media

Be very aware of profile photos on Facebook and Skype. ALL photos represent who YOU are, and can create a strong impression when applying for a job. Tattoos and pics of drinking seem funny.... but they can seriously impact the impression you give the club. This applies for ANY prospective employer.

Things you should know...



Orientation

All students going to America are required to attend BSG's half-day Orientation in London. Held on a June afternoon, it is an invaluable opportunity to learn, and to meet the people you will be living with – your new bff's.

We strongly recommend you stay the evening. After the orientation, you go out with others going to your club, and spend an evening getting to know each other. BSG Alums highly recommend this.



Getting to Florida

Travel timing is coordinated with BSG and the club. We inform you which airport to fly into and what date to arrive there. Some like to fly in earlier, perhaps meeting others from their group for a few days in New York or Orlando or Las Vegas before arriving at the club.



Costs

Costs of Visa, Flight and Housing are the FULL responsibility of each Intern. A few clubs offer some level of assistance or subsidy either during the internship, or an end-of-program bonus. Interns who commit early to securing a job have broader options of clubs to select from. BSG does NOT charge students anything for their services.



Pay Structure/ Housing

Most students earn \$10 per hour, up to 40 hours, plus overtime beyond that.

Meals are provided each work shift.

Housing costs vary per club and are deducted from paychecks every two weeks.

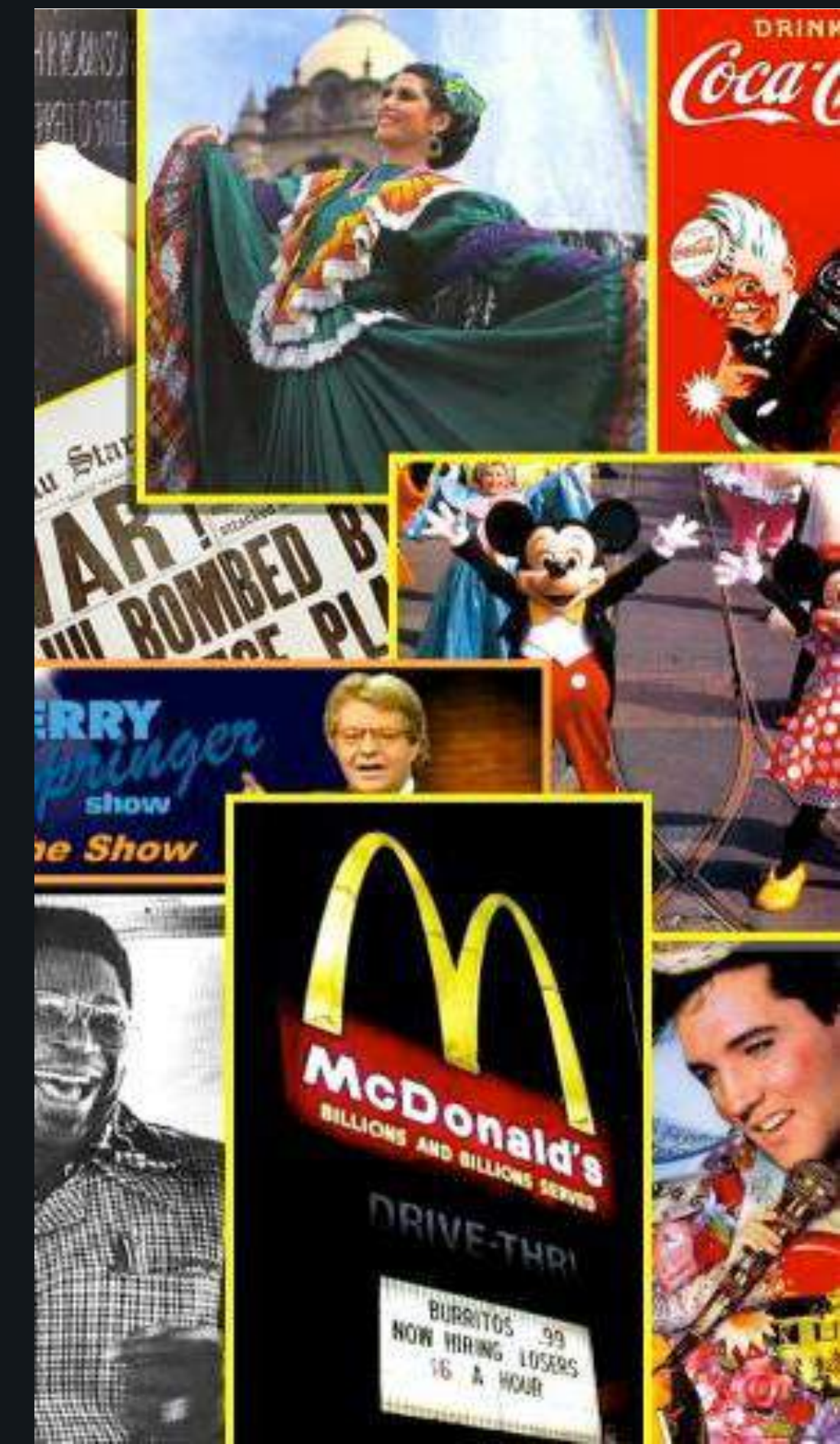

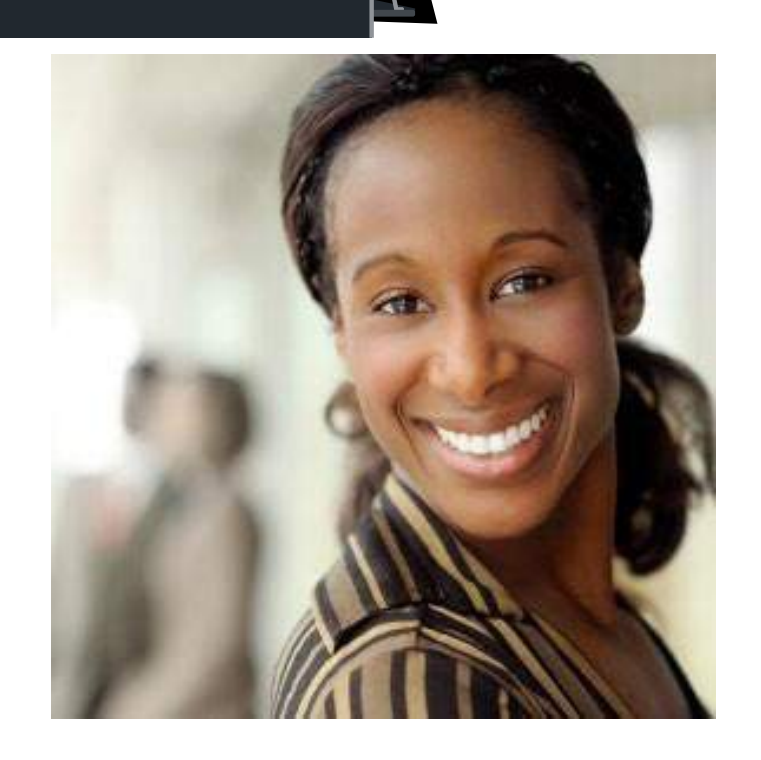

BSG Expectations of Interns

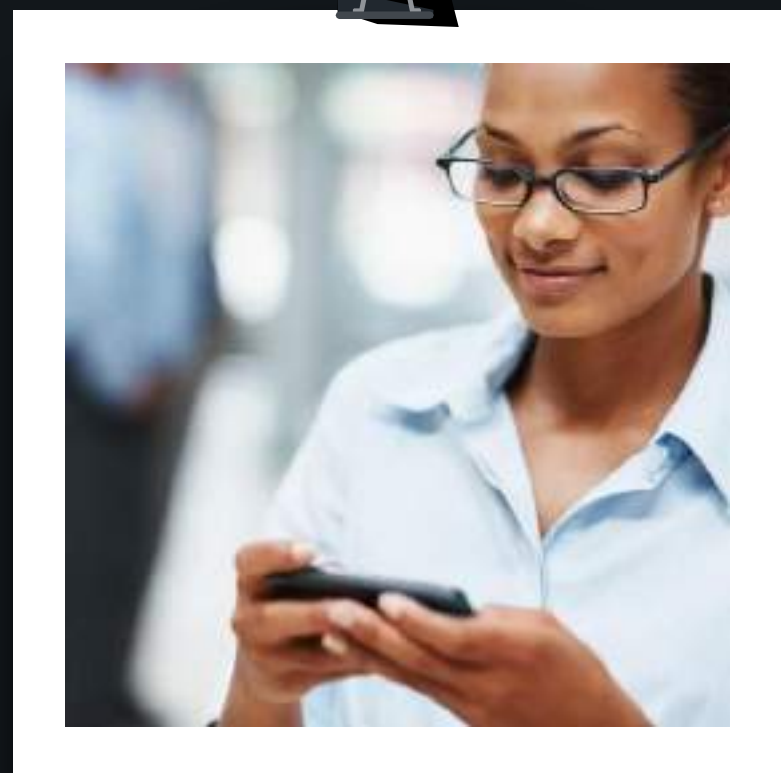


Attitude

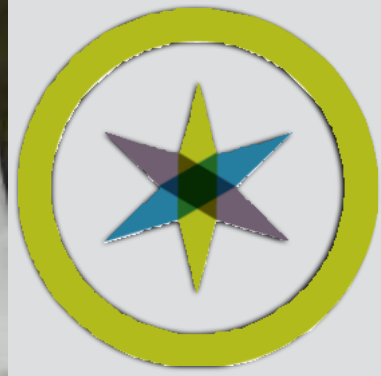
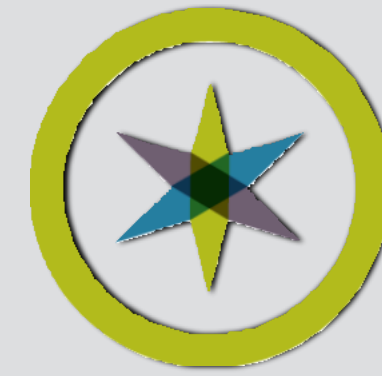

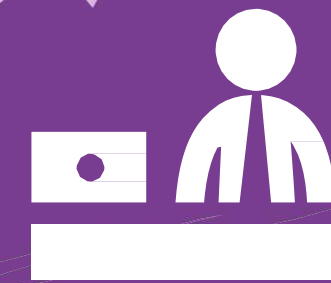
To say no to this opportunity is easy.
