



Regulations for the International Summer School Programme

- 1. The International Summer School is intended for anyone wishing to spend a short period of time studying at the UAB.
- Courses are taught in Spanish or English. It is the students' responsibility to find out the language of instruction for each subject and to ensure that their level is adequate to follow the course. (The recommended level is B1.1 in the Common European Framework of Reference for languages.)
- 3. Enrolment documents and any additional documentation that might be required should be sent to the International Summer School's administrative offices at the following address: <u>international.summer.school@uab.es</u>
- 4. Applicants should pay the total fees corresponding to the courses that they have selected *before these courses begin*. Any application that does not contain payment for the selected courses will not be deemed valid.
- 5. In the event of (i) not coming to the first day of classes or (ii) ending course attendance before the programmed date, students will not have any right to a refund of the fees paid and will additionally lose all rights deriving from enrolment.
- 6. Students will have the right to attend classes and to obtain a certificate of accreditation. None of the studies successfully completed in this manner shall in any way whatsoever constitute an official qualification.
- At the end of the course, participants will receive a certificate of attendance. Students are responsible for ensuring the official recognition of the academic credits obtained through these courses, should this be necessary for them.
- 8. For those students who, having finished their participation in the International Summer School, subsequently wish to gain access to the university's regular studies, application must be carried out through the ordinary, established procedures for access to Spanish universities. Participation in this programme shall not signify either an advantage or a disadvantage in the event of applying for official university studies.

- 9. There is no minimum or maximum number of courses for which students may enrol, always providing that the respective timetables and calendars do not overlap.
- Pre-enrolment application dates for all courses begin on March 1 and end on June 1. The total amount of the cost of the enrolment must be paid before June 15.
