

## SPEAKING TEST – B2.1

### PART 1 (1-2 minutes per candidate)

#### PERSONAL INFORMATION

Candidates are asked questions regarding personal information.

- **Holidays & travel:** Do you like travelling? What do you consider was one of your best holidays?
- Languages: Is travelling a good way to learn languages? Why/ why not?

## PART 2 (2-3 minutes per candidate)

### **MONOLOGUE**

Candidates are asked to read a short text and speak about a topic, giving their opinion and relating it to their own experience with relevant examples.

Before the speaking test, candidates are given 6-7 minutes to read the text and take notes to organise their ideas into a structured monologue in the preparation room.



**B2.1 - PART 02 - 00A** 

You have 6 minutes to read the text and take notes to give a structured monologue in which you give your opinion and relate it to your own experience with relevant examples.

In the speaking test, you can refer to your notes but you cannot read word for word.
