



Call for an MSc student in Environmental Studies

Adaptation to climate change in small-scale agriculture: what role for crop diversity?

Requisite: Student of the Master in Interdisciplinary Studies in Environmental, Economic and Social Sustainability (MEISAES, ICTA-UAB), fluent in English.

Description: This call is offered within the framework of the "Crop diversity" group of the ERC funded project LICCI "Local Indicators of Climate Change Impacts" (www.licci.eu). As part of the LICCI project, a group of researchers has created a database compiling peer reviewed articles describing local adaptations to climate change. The MSc student working on this project will explore this database to analyze the relevance of crop diversification as a strategy that small-farmers use to adapt to climate change. The student working in this thesis will

- (A) Review the existing database on local adaptation strategies to select papers addressing local adaptation developed by small-farmer communities around the world.
- (B) Complete the database with papers not included now in the database.
- (C) Analyze the distribution of different local adaptation strategies focusing on "crop/landrace diversification".

The analysis of these data will constitute the core of the students' Master thesis. This is a fully deskbased MSc research project.

Technical details: The thesis will be directed by Victoria Reyes-García and Anna Schlingmann, researchers at the LICCI project. Other members of the LICCI team might also provide support. We expect that a revised version of the MSc Thesis could be submitted to a peer-reviewed journal for publication (e.g., Ecology and Society, Agriculture and Human values).

Opportunities: The MSc student will be part of a research team working on interdisciplinary socialecological research at ICTA-UAB, benefitting from direct interactions with a number of highly-qualified international researchers (<u>http://www.laseg.cat/en</u> and <u>https://licci.eu/</u>).
