### **Prerequisites**

This course is designed for students with Spanish as their first language. At the beginning of the course students should be able to understand, speak and write in Spanish with a certain degree of complexity about general themes and a wide range of areas, styles and registers.

# Note for exchange students

Exchange students, or those who do not have native competency, should see course 101284 Spanish as a foreign language for translators and interpreters 1, which is also offered in one-semester modules.

#### Learning objectives

The aim of this course is to consolidate the students' grammatical competency in their A language (Spanish) in preparation for direct and inverse translation so that they are qualified to produce non-specialised texts and understand texts reflecting a certain degree of complexity.

Upon finishing the course, the student should be able to:

- Demonstrate that they have mastered the basic grammar skills to be able to translate and interpret.
- Produce non-specialised texts covering various text types, in a clear, well-structured manner, and in a style adapted to the target reader.
- Understand a variety of texts which reflect a degree of complexity.

## Competencies

#### Assessment criteria

- Assessment of knowledge of information sources: 10%
- Assessment of lexical and morphological knowledge: 30%
- Assessment of syntactic knowledge: 30%
- Assessment of writing skills: 30%

These categories may vary from year to year.
