Prerequisites

At the beginning of the course students should be able to:

- Understand different types of written texts about general topics in familiar subject areas. (CEFR-FTI B2.1)
- Write fairly complex texts about personal and general topics in familiar subject areas. (CEFR-FTI B1.2)
- Understand simple and clearly pronounced utterances in Japanese about everyday topics. (CEFR-FTI A2.1)
- Express themselves in spoken Japanese on everyday topics using simple constructions. (CEFR-FTI A2.1)
- Solve translation problems in simple non-specialised texts in Standard Japanese covering a range of text types (presentations, discussion, instructive).

Learning objectives

The aim of this course is to continue developing students' Foreign Language C (Japanese) communicative competencies, as well as consolidate their translating skills in a range of simple non-specialised Standard Japanese texts. 2 ECTS are for language skills and 4 credits for translation exercises.

At the end of the course students should be able to:

- Understand different types of written texts, with fairly complex constructions about general topics in familiar subject areas. (CEFR-FTI B2.2)
- Write fairly complex texts about personal and general topics in familiar subject areas. (CEFR-FTI B1.2)
- Understand clearly pronounced Japanese on everyday topics (CEFR-FTI A2.2)
- Express themselves in spoken Japanese on everyday topics. (CEFR-FTI A2.2)
- Resolve translation problems in non-specialised texts covering different modes tenor and styles.
- Resolve translation problems rooted in cultural references.
- Resolve translation problems in simple specialised texts from a variety of fields.
