# **Prerequisites**

- Language requirements: German C1.2 (CEFR). Exchange students should contact the course coordinator regarding Catalan language level requirements.
- Have taken 101421 Foreign-language literature for translators (German), or equivalent.

At the beginning of the course students should be able to:

- Demonstrate knowledge of the basic methodological principles governing translation, professional and instrumental aspects and the contrastive problems for this language combination.
- Demonstrate they are familiar with literary trends in German.
- Differentiate between literary genres and identify their specific features.
- Apply strategies to further their literary knowledge to be able to translate.
- Apply literary knowledge to be able to translate.

### Learning objectives

The aim of this course is to develop problem-solving skills when translating literary texts reflecting different genres.

By the end of this course students should be able to:

- Read and interpret literary texts written German from the 19th and 20<sup>th</sup> centuries.
- Develop strategies for translating these texts into Catalan.
- Resolve specific translation problems in this context.
