
Contents overview

Geography of Global Change is an optional second cycle course in Geography. The course has a total of 6 theory credits and includes a series of practical assignments.

The main objective of the course is to explore causes, processes and consequences of global environmental change in the world today, with particular emphasis on human influence. Despite being global in extent, this change may manifest itself uniquely and differently depending on the temporal and spatial scales examined. The course considers the Earth as a system, and bases everything on the concepts of Earth System Science. Despite global-scale influences, more local-scale manifestations of such processes will also be explored and examined. Global environmental change is partly driven by human activities, with sometimes unexpected and indirect consequences. Some of these global change processes have become the subject of international attention and agreements, with the aim of minimizing negative impacts.

The course will be subdivided into introductory concepts and distinctions, and followed by distinct environmental spheres of impact, including the atmosphere, the oceans, and the land surfaces. With these distinctions in mind, constant exploration of more focused elements will occur, considering human population growth, urbanization, water and land use, transportation, energy and other resource consumption, pollution, and more. In the 3rd and final week, the class will have a collective field trip to Barcelona (Montjuic and environs) to explore many aspects

of urban global change.


Contents overview

From the Television Studies theoretical framework, the subject provides basic knowledge on contemporary television, especially in the introduction to structural, technological and aesthetic factors, which are defining TV products. In this sense, also tools for analysis and interpretation for television programs are defined, training students with critical skills to analyse the current television discourse in an international scope.

The acquisition of knowledge and skills by the students will be done through different methodological procedures that include lectures in the classroom, exercises of analysis, debate and reflection from watching TV shows and reading materials. These learning activities will take place during lectures, seminars, and tutorials. Each lecturer or seminar will include the viewing, analysis and debate of a TV show according to the issues. discussed in each session.

The main goal of this class is to review and analyze international television content from a genre perspective. We mainly focus on television content in a increasingly global and crossmedia market. The class will approach different subjects as scheduling, formats, international industry dynamics or crossmedia content, among others.

María Carmen de Toro received her master in Computer Science at the UAB in 2012. She has been working as an Associate Professor at UAB since 2005.



Contents overview

Computer networks, and Internet in particular, have become a basic tool for all knowledge disciplines. In this course, we are going to analyse how they are designed and how they operate, focussing on the networks using the TCP/IP protocol family (internet). The topic will be addressed from three different perspectives: the interconnection of networks, the end-to-end interaction of computers, and user applications. Besides, other fascinating technologies will be addressed such as the Deep Web (TOR routing and hidden services), network attacks, and basic network security tools.

The main objective of this course is that students get an overall vision of the main concepts related to heterogeneous computer networks, their interconnection, the protocols they use, and the basic development of network software. When finishing this course, students will be able to design extensible and robust internets, to configure networks, to detect and solve network problems due to misconfiguration or attacks to their protocols, and to develop the basic communication component of applications.

The student is expected to attend to classes, to solve a list of problems at home, to pass two tests and a final exam, and to develop three practical exercises in the lab. The teacher team continuously assists the students in their learning process, combining theoretical explanations with hands-on examples.



Do you want to improve your critical thinking skills? In everyday life we are constantly giving reasons to believe things and take decisions. In this introductory course you will learn how to identify arguments, how to evaluate them, and how to avoid fallacies, thinking mistakes that lead to the formation of bad beliefs. Critical argumentation is a practical skill that needs to be learned, from the very beginning, through the use of real examples of arguments. The real arguments we will analyze in the course will give practice in putting the desired skills to work. The methods presented are based on the latest state-of the-art techniques developed in argumentation theory and informal logic.

During the course we will organize an Argument Writing Workshop where the students could put into practice the different learned skills. There are no prerequisites to this course.

Claudio Cattaneo holds a PhD in ecological economics from UAB, the same place the International Society for Ecological Economics was founded back in 1987. He is also a degrowth activist and one of the founding members of the association Research and Degrowth, which from 2008 promotes the divulgation of degrowth ideas in academic circles. He is now an Associate Professor at UAB and has been teaching Ecological Economics Principles and lecturing about Degrowth since 2003 in different European universities.



Contents overview

The conventional economic model is based on the hypothesis of infinite monetary growth, made of virtual bank money. Nonetheless it also requires considerable inputs of energy and materials, which are not infinite and have an impact on our planet. Environmental signals show us we are on the edge of a crisis and the uncertainty about our future environment relates to the development of a new discipline: ecological economics.

The course aims at presenting a new perspective in the economic field by relating it to the environment: it will consider the possibility of green economic growth, the main dilemmas and implications for the environment; students will be able to contrast two economic visions, that of growth-based economics and of ecological economics and the real-world implications of each one: the trade-off between economic growth (and job creation) and environmental protection and social justice. As well it aims to re-embed economic analysis with social and human dimensions.

The course will adopt Team-Based Learning a novel teaching method in which the students have to read compulsory material prior to the class, and will be evaluated with a closed-answer quiz at the start of each class, first to be answered alone, then with the team. The rest of the class will consist of a short traditional lecture (magistral class), watching a documentary related to the topic of the day, team work analysing the documentary, a presentation to the class by a team randomly selected and a class discussion based on the video presentation and the theory exposed. Homework assignments will be reading the material for the next day and, in the third week when all groups will have already presented, the writing of a report based on the video presentation and the feed-back obtained in class. The final mark will be based on the results of the closed-answer tests and the written report. In the last three days there will be two visits to


Psychology is an incredibly rich discipline, and includes health, social, educational, judicial, and other aspects. Knowledge of behavior and the mind requires, among others, understanding the biological bases that support them. This is the goal of Psychobiology. In order to be able to understand the biological substrate of behavior and mental processes, it is necessary to know of the components and functioning the nervous system. The subject intends to provide the necessary knowledge of neuron and neurochemical physiology to study the relationships between the different behavioral processes and their biological substrate. We propose that upon completion of the course the student is able to understand and to use correctly the subject terminology and to demonstrate knowledge of:

- The main characteristics of neurons and glial cells.
- The characteristics of the nervous impulse and its conduction.
- The characteristics of the synaptic transmission and of the most well-known transmitter systems.



This Summer Term course is part of basic formation (6 ECTS credits) requirements for the firstyear East Asia Studies Degree students in the Departament of Translation and Interpretation & East Asian Studies (FTI). The aim of this course is to understand the profound social, political, economic, and other transformations taking place in China, India, Japan and Korea. A specific emphasis will be on comparing the evolution of these countries to perceived change and what changes in Asia might reveal about regional and world history. The course will focus on five broad themes: 1) Asia? Europe? The relativity and the history of the geographic and political concepts; 2) Asia cultures and civilizations before waking up in Europe; 3) Europe's link to Asia: colonialism and imperialism (18th-19th centuries); 4) Asian resistance to assimilation (19th and 20th centuries); 5) Nationalism and nation Construction in Asia. Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to: 1) Identity major concepts, problems, and historical questions in the field of Asian History and be able to connect them to broader themes in European history. 2)Demonstrate competence in how different Asian civilization's evolution interacted and, communicated, due to their heritage. 3) Compare the difference and coincidence between these Asian civilizations. 4) Apply some of the major problems in Asian history to address current social and political issues.



Planet Earth is an introductory course whose principal objectives are understanding Earth as a global System and the interactions that exist among its solid parts, hydrosphere, atmosphere and biosphere-anthroposphere. Also, it is designed to help students understand the spatial and temporal scales in planetary processes. With these objectives in mind we first study Earth in its cosmic and Solar system contexts, the processes of planetary formation, the characteristics of primitive Earth, the origin of solid Earth internal structure and how it was discovered, how geologists have depicted and use the time-scale framework of Earth evolution, the theory of Plate Tectonics as the present paradigm explaining how the solid part of Earth works and the key issues in Atmosphere – Hydrosphere – solid Earth interactions. Finally, the relationships among Earth System processes and the Biosphere – Anthroposphere are illuminated through the study of the main causes of climate change, the sustainability of energy use by humans and how carbon "C", one of the basic life constitutive chemical elements, circulates through Earth systems.



Career development has been traditionally based on an individualistic search-and-matching labour market model. The Skills Commission's Inquiry into information, advice and guidance indicated in 2008 that the matching model is 100 years out of date. However, when conditions offered by the labour market are becoming increasingly precarious and inequality is on the rise, the reasons that brought about the birth of career development are fully in force. Career development links its beginnings to a social movement that saw as a moral imperative to contribute so "workers in the burgeoning economy of the early twentieth century were not seen as the chattels of employers, not as property to be consumed and cast aside, but rather as persons of dignity with a right to determine their own future" (Herr, 2001, p. 198). How does one pursue a career development process for the 21st century that accomplishes the same purposes, and yet adds the alignment of individual achievement and social justice?

This subject will benefit those who, regardless of the career path they are interested in, want to explore and carry out career development strategies aimed at fostering their own and also collective well-being. Through a combination of individual and group activities, you will learn to identify your strengths and improvement areas, to analyse the interpersonal and contextual risk and protection factors that may hinder or foster a fulfilling and socially fair career path, and to define action plans aimed at reducing the risk factors and enhancing the identified protection factors. The learning sessions will be dynamic, participatory and practice-oriented, with your enhanced career development as their main outcome.



Teachers are bombarded with proposals to innovate in their lessons but teaching a foreign language is sometimes a rather solitary task. The course's main purpose is to offer people interested in the field of foreign language teaching "food for thought" and resources to make children's learning experiences much more updated, fun, simple, dynamic and adapted to the 21st century competencies and skills they need to master.

The course is divided into 15 three-hour thematic sessions. Each session will evolve around one particular relevant topic related to the teaching of English (or other languages) to young and very young learners (students aged 3-12), but connections will be made between one session/topic and the others. All sessions will combine brief theoretical explanations with a broad array of practical activities in which participants are expected to engage. Attendees will also be asked to participate and/or lead group discussion to share (and contrast) their opinions, ideas, knowledge, beliefs, doubts, and experiences upon the implementation of the practical activities

No prior experience in teaching English (or a foreign language) to children and very young children is required. Yet, the course is designed to suit the needs of in-service teachers too. Given the practical nature of the course, attendance is compulsory. On day one, we will discuss with participants the possibility of paying a visit to a local school and to the city of Barcelona to have a chance to get to know Catalan culture better.



This is a specialized unit dedicated to the care provision, training and research for critical situations, and devoted to society, public administration, professionals, social agents and companies, who are or can be affected by a crisis, disasters and/or conflict. Contents overview

Cities are the new frontline of terrorism, especially those which are important touristic destinations. The main purpose of today's terrorists is not only to target civilians and spread fear, but also to turn city residents against each other and to negatively impact on the economy of the city. The first massive attacks in New York (2001), Madrid (2004), and Tunis (2015) generated confusion and doubts in the way of responding to terror. Cities were "unprepared" and had little experience in recovering from such sad experiences. However, at least after the terrorist attack in Bataclan (Paris, 2015) during a concert we know that terrorist attacks are very diverse in terms of location, impact and the perpetrators. Furthermore, we can learn further on the ways a city recovers from such terror.

This course defends two theses. The first claims that terrorist attacks against civilian targets in very touristy cities have become a fearsome reality that has an impact not only on emotional well-being, but also on economy and social cohesion. The second thesis claims that the way in which a city recovers from a terrorist attack depends directly on how it has prepared itself for these types of incidents and on a multidisciplinary approach to the recovery process, including the citizens of the attacked city themselves. In this course you will be trained on an integrative model that will allow you to prepare your city or community to manage a future event involving multiple victims, and to understand the keys to a good recovery if this incident finally happens.



As it is known, Psychological First Aid (PFA) is an evidence-informed approach for assisting all the population in the aftermath of a critical event. PFA ameliorates symptoms of Acute Stress Disorder (ASD) and prevents Post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). In this course you will be trained in the application of PFA on both massive and daily emergencies. You will become a community health worker prepared to cope with highly stressful situations everywhere.
