Internship in a institution to develop skills in practical intervention. The Faculty has a network of institutions coping different educational fields such as childhood, young people, adults, training in organisations, assessment, among others. The internship includes seminars at the school and tutorships. The student has a professional tutor and an academic supervisor.

Students interested in doing an Internship period should pay a **complementary insurance** (check the price for each course) at the time of registration (once the students arrive at the Faculty). The complementary insurance is a service offered by the University that consists of accident and civil responsibility insurance for university students resident in Spain.

It is required the Certificate of Good Conduct that enables individuals to work with minors in Spain:

Anyone working with children and young people in Spain is required to have a certificate from the Spanish authorities which states that they have never been convicted of a sex-related crime (with adults or children). Foreign students are also required to have a similar certificate from their country of origin. It must be issued in English and must not be older than 3 months at the time of the beginning of the erasmus stay.
