

Creole Intensive Programme 2024: Anthropological Voices.

OBJECTIVES AND DESCRIPTION (in short)

This BIP is a 7 day programme of workshops and presentations which will bring together students and staff from the 7 partner institutions involved in the joint-Masters programme, CREOLE: Cultural Differences and Transnational Processes, along with members of a new potential partner institution (Panteion University of Athens). The BIP performs an integral role within the CREOLE joint-MA programme, forming part of the curriculum in the third semester of study. It aims to enhance participants' understandings of theories, methods and issues within the practice of Anthropology in Europe.

METHODS AND OUTCOMES (in short)

This BIP features virtual meetups before and after one week of intensive face-to-face presentations and workshops. We will focus on the role of language, translation and discourse in anthropological research and analysis, along with their role in the public propagation of our research findings. This BIP will promote cooperation and integration within the discipline of Anthropology across Europe, while enhancing participants' skills and understandings regarding the practice of ethnographic research and role of Anthropology within the public sphere.

Physical component: 16-27 June, 2024

Virtual component: 4 June and 4 July, 2024.

Virtual components are 1.5 hour meetings, tentatively scheduled for 1pm IST (Irish Summer time, = GMT+1).

More definite information and links will be sent before the event. The 4 June meeting will consist of introductions and dissemination of information about the physical BIP. The 4 July meeting will consist of a follow-up discussion of themes and issues raised during the BIP, and preparation for students' written assignments post-BIP.

Tuesday 4 June meeting: Introductions, Planning, Introduction of theme

Thursday 4 July meeting: Follow up discussion, discussion of assignment, general feedback.
