The Service for Inclusion at UAB. Support for Students with Specific Educational Needs (PIUNE) aims to ensure equal opportunities for all students. The service advises prospective UAB students and promotes support measures for students with disabilities or special educational needs throughout their studies. The PIUNE arranges transport services adapted to the Bellaterra Campus and an accompaniment service on foot for persons with orientation difficulties.






Entre Joves Mentoring Programme

5 ENVIRONMENTAL VOLUNTEER PROGRAMME

The FAS Environmental Volunteer Programme is a space within the UAB campus dedicated to education, awareness, and activism in environmental issues. With the aim of promoting environmental responsibility at the university, the group of volunteers carries out activities of environmental education and awareness, biodiversity protection and management, and ecological activism. These activities are carried out in coordination with the UAB Campus Sustainability Office, as well as with other university groups and services with similar objectives.

6 HEALTH

The Health Programme promotes awareness-raising activities, training, and curricular impact actions on the UAB campus for a healthy experience of sexuality, healthy habits and consumption, and a comprehensive understanding of mental health and psychological distress to enable coping or support for discomfort from an intersectional perspective among university youth.

7 SOCIO-EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMES

Aimed at children living in vulnerable situations who are at higher risk of academic failure. This programme aims to help them regain interest in learning through workshops run by UAB students.

Socio-educational mentoring with high-school students

A programme to improve the academic performance and personal development of young adolescents in secondary schools in the municipalities of Cerdanyola del Vallès and Rubí. This initiative targets students with social and economic disadvantages who show signs of disengagement in the early stages of high school, with the aim of ensuring their continued participation in compulsory education. University mentors provide guidance and support to help these students overcome challenges and achieve success.

Prometeus Programme

Prometeus is a programme funded by the Barcelona City Council, the Association for Comprehensive Education of Raval district in Barcelona (AEIR) and the Association de la Fondation Etudiante pour la Ville (AFEV), which offers academically talented young people from complex socio-economic situations the opportunity to access university studies.

The FAS provides personalised support and guidance throughout their university studies to ensure successful completion.



8 UAB SOLIDARITY FUND

As a university committed to addressing global challenges, UAB works to promote collaborative actions that harness the expertise and potential of its university community for global justice. The <u>Solidarity Fund</u> serves to promote, finance and support projects with a global justice perspective. It is therefore the instrument for the promotion of university cooperation initiatives. The Fund has two annual calls for grants: one for teaching and administrative staff (PDI and PAS) and the other for postgraduate students.

9 REFUGEE HOSTING PROGRAMME

This programme provides accommodation on the UAB campus for people in refugee situations or in need of international protection. It offers comprehensive study support and develops volunteering and social action projects, as well as training and awareness initiatives.





Welcoming, Study Support and Social Mentoring:

- 37 Applicants for international protection have stayed in the Vila Universitària and received personalised support.
- Refugee students have access to undergraduate and postgraduate programmes at UAB through the #UABRefugi scholarship for the 2022-2023 academic year.
- 13 UAB students volunteered as social mentors for these young refugees.

Grants for individuals in a refugee situation

- #UABRefugi scholarships, promoting the ability of individuals in refugee situations to resume their university studies at UAB based on equal rights and opportunities.
- 20 Study grants. Thanks to the Enginy Grants and the funds raised as part of the #EmergenciaUcraïna campaign, these grants have been awarded to finance expenses related to the development of university studies.
 - 6 Salary grants: 3 for students of the *Joves en Construcció de Pau* project; 2 for students benefiting from the UAB agreement with the organisation Jusoor; and 1 for a student of the Protect Defenders and Novact project.

Awareness raising, mobilisation, and curriculum advocacy

The project also carries out activities to promote a critical understanding of the structural causes of forced displacement and to facilitate spaces for organisation and tools for action within the university community. Curriculum advocacy activities on migration, gender, human rights, peacebuilding, and anti-racism have been carried out in UAB faculties.

1.000 Community members have participated in training and awareness-raising activities on these issues.





Some of the most important training activities have been the following:

DiaspoART workshops: Migrations through art, with ECTS recognition.

Workshops on peace activism: organised together with the School for a Culture of Peace of the UAB.

Debate on Artificial Intelligence and Human Rights.

Al-shatat Film Forum - Stories of Diasporas in the Arab World: Several films were screened that dealt with migration phenomena in the Middle East.

The FAS has joined the CHAT Plus project - Changing Attitudes Plus - co-funded by the European Union, which implements awareness and communication campaigns to eradicate female genital mutilation, focusing on the involvement of young people from affected communities. During the academic year, the planning of the campaign's dissemination activities and the organisation of a training for young activists were initiated.

11 GLOBAL JUSTICE EDUCATION PROJECT AT THE UNIVERSITY

The FAS is working to mainstream global justice education in the university. This year it has implemented the *Pluridiversitat* project, which aims to transform the university into a driving force for global justice, linked to the territory and generating emancipatory knowledge processes to face global challenges.





Funded by the Barcelona City Council, the project has carried out:

Training activities with curricular impact: **5** workshops were held in undergraduate courses at the Faculties of **Education and Communication Sciences**.

Sixth edition of the Arcadi Oliveres Awards for the best undergraduate thesis on sustainable development and global justice

A new call was published for the awarding of prizes for bachelor's theses to be carried out in the academic year 2021-2022 on topics related to sustainable development and global justice.

56 Applications received.

28 Awards from different UAB degrees.

The award ceremony took place on 28 March, where the winners were able to explain how their work contributes to global justice and sustainable development.

University communication campaign #FemJustíciaGlobal:

A series of short videos were published on social networks in which UAB students share the contributions they have made to global justice through research experiences or university social participation. In these videos, students reflect on topics such as human rights, critical interculturality, environmental justice, economic justice, feminist perspective, peace, and non-violence, providing concrete examples and content to make the often-abstract idea of global justice more understandable.



12 SERVICE LEARNING

Service-learning (ApS) is an educational approach that combines learning and community service in a single project, where participants learn by working on real community needs with the aim of improving them. Service-learning is therefore an educational project with a social benefit.



The FAS manages the UAB ApS office, which is responsible for promoting service-learning at the UAB and to external entities, and for monitoring all processes involving faculty, students and third sector entities.

108 Needs/proposals from social and environmental organisations, as well as public institutions and centres, for UAB students to carry out their Final Degree Projects with ApS.

University Service-Learning Congress

From 25 to 27 January, the University Service-Learning Congress took place at the Casa Convalescència, UAB, organised by the twelve Catalan universities through the ApS(U)CAT network. The ApS office participated in the organising committee and the scientific committee. The Service-Learning Innovation Group of UAB presented the study "Social Impact of University Service-Learning: Analysis of UAB Programs", where Mr José Luis Lalueza and Ms Sílvia Blanch presented the conclusions drawn from the analysis of 53 service-learning experiences at UAB between 2019 and 2021.

IV Aps Conference in the university environment

On 5th May, the 4th Edition of the ApS Conference took place. It was an opportunity to connect organisations, educators, and students with this methodology. It was a chance to build links between the university and the social sector, with the aim of working together through service learning in final degree projects. The day started with a keynote speech from the University of the Balearic Islands, followed by the awarding of prizes to the best final degree projects using this methodology. Participants took part in a hands-on workshop on service learning and global justice, before concluding with a visit to the organisation fair.




