3) What is the follow-up test

The annual follow-up sessions of the Doctoral Program in Spanish Philology requires the presentation of reports by all students. To produce the report, students should use a predefined report available on the virtual campus. The students' reports will be uploaded on the virtual campus space provided by on September 6, 2025, at 12:00 a.m. the latest. The report should contains a summary of the thesis with a provisional table of contents, a description of the advance of the investigation and an explanation of the planning of the research for the next academic year. The student may add more information related to formative activities that he or she may have taken. The thesis supervisor must sign the report.

The supervisor of students in second-year and those in subsequent years must also provide a brief report, signed by them, with a description on the student's progress during the year. These reports must be sent on September 6, 2025, to the following e-mail address: uisad.filologies.tercer.cicle@uab.cat.

Each student will have 10 minutes to present their progress report orally in front of a committee comprised of three doctors from the Department of Spanish Language and Literature in a public session. At the end of the presentation, the committee will have 10 minutes to make comments and the student will be able to answer the questions. Before the follow-up sessions, the coordination sends the reports of the students and the supervisors (from the second follow-up onwards) to the committee so that they can take them into account when making the assessment.

*In the event that there is a negative evaluation in the test called, the Academic Committee of the Doctoral Program will summon the affected doctoral student within the period set by the regulations.
