DOCTORAL THESIS BY PUBLICATIONS

The doctoral student must request authorisation from the doctoral programme's Academic Committee to present the thesis as a compendium of publications, before depositing it.

1. REQUIREMENTS

- 1. A minimum of three articles from published and/or accepted academic journals, all on the same lines of research, published in peer-reviewed journals, indexed in international impact-factor databases (SCI / SSCI, SCOPUS ...).
- 2. The doctoral student must be listed as the sole signatory (i.e., no co-authorship) for at least one of the articles.
- 3. Articles must have been published or accepted for publication after the date of registration/admission of the thesis project/research plan.
- 4. Articles must not have been used in previous thesis.
- 5. The publications must include either the doctoral student's affiliation, i.e., "Department of Sociology, Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona (UAB)"; or in the acknowledgments or in a footnote the following expression: "This work has been carried out within the framework of the doctoral programme in Sociology at the Universitat Autònoma de Barcelona".

2. DOCUMENTATION (To be submitted to the Department's Administrative Office)

- 1. Application for a compendium of publications duly completed and signed by the doctoral student (available on the Doctoral School website).
- 2. Report from the thesis director indicating the suitability of this thesis presentation by compendium, as well as the complete references that constitute the compendium and the impact factor of the journals in question.
- Acceptance form from the co-authors of the article, confirming that they have been informed
 and accept that the article will be included in the compendium and relinquishing the use of the
 said article as part of another thesis.
- 4. Letter of acceptance from the journal in the event that any of the articles have not yet been published.

3. FORMAT OF THE DOCTORAL THESIS BY COMPENDIUM OF PUBLICATIONS

Doctoral thesis presented as a compendium of publications must contain the following sections, although not necessarily in the same order:

- 1. An introduction presenting the objectives of the thesis and justifying its thematic unity.
- 2. An overall summary of the most relevant contributions or results.
- 3. Fina conclusions.
- 4. A copy of all the Works that form part of the thesis.
